

STUDENT CARD**Task 2 (2–3 minutes)**

You play the part of an exchange student in an international school. You meet your classmate Nicolas/ Nicole in the school corridor. He/she wasn't in the morning class.

- Greet him/her and ask what's wrong;
- Make sure he/she has visited the doctor (the medical room is in Building A on the ground floor); offer your help, if needed;
- Agree to fulfill your classmate's request, if any.

You begin the conversation. The examiner will play the part of your classmate.

- find out the needed factual information asking questions;

C3. INTERLOCUTOR CARD**Task 2 (2–3 minutes)**

You play the part of an exchange student in an international school. Your name is Nicolas/ Nicole. You fell ill and you weren't in the morning class. You meet your classmate in the school corridor.

- Explain that you had fallen ill and hadn't attend the class for that reason
- Find out where the doctor is.
- Ask your classmate to warn the volleyball coach that you won't be able to play in the match that day. The coach is usually in the gym at that time of the day.

Skills to be tested:

The student is expected to demonstrate his/her ability to:

- find out the needed factual information asking questions;
- maintain and conclude the conversation;
- be active and polite.

SAMPLE CONVERSATION*

Student: Hello, Nicolas/Nicole. Nice to see you. You missed the morning class today. What happened?

Interlocutor: I've fallen ill I'm afraid. I feel terrible.

Student: You need to stay in bed then. Have you visited the doctor yet?

Interlocutor: Not yet. I don't even know if there's a doctor in our campus.

Student: There definitely is. The medical room is in Building A, on the ground floor. Let's go there right now, I'll show you the way.

Interlocutor: Thanks, but I'll find it myself. There's another thing I wanted to ask you.

Student: What is it?

Interlocutor: Could you warn my volleyball coach that I won't be able to play in today's match. He needs time to find another player.

Student: Yes, sure. Where can I find him?

Interlocutor: He's always in the gym at this time of the day.

Student: I'm going there right now. Call me after you see the doctor.

Interlocutor: OK. Thank you. I'll call. See you.

Student: See you later.

Student Card 3

- the assistant's responsibilities
- the junior babysitter's responsibilities
- the working hour

You begin the conversation. The examiner will play the part of the hotel manager.

- decide which job you are going to apply for

Student Card 4

- You are staying in London with a group of other students. You would like to buy a present to your friend. You know that she likes milk chocolate very much. You can't spend more than £15 on the present.

Before making a decision ask the shop assistant about

- whether they can recommend anything special for the present
- whether they have milk chocolate
- the price

You begin the conversation. The examiner will play the part of the shop assistant.

Remember to:

- be active and polite
- ask questions and find out all the information you need
- decide which kind of chocolate you will buy

Interlocutor Card 4

You are a shop assistant in a shop in London. After student's greeting start the conversation: "Hello! Can I help you?"

You've got the following information about the kinds of chocolate you have:

1. "Cadbury Roses" and "Milk Chocolate Deluxe" are wonderful chocolate gift boxes. They are popular with British chocolate lovers. These gifts are suitable for anyone and always appreciated.
2. Both "Cadbury Roses" and "Milk Chocolate Deluxe" have milk chocolates of different shape and design.
3. "Cadbury Roses" is £10 per box and "Milk Chocolate Deluxe" is more expensive, it's £15 per box.

To finish the conversation say, "Well, have you made your choice?.. Fine. It's a really wonderful present."
